




We shall be sending out an email nearer the time, giving more details and guidance as to what materials can and cannot go in the skip.

petrol tools that we use to carry out site maintenance, however the lack of secure storage has become an issue. Also, after the success of last years allotment shop, we would like to extend the service, but again we need better storage facilities. After considering the options, we are exploring the possibility of acquiring a secure shipping container, so we applied to Knaresborough Town Council and were granted permission to put a shipping container near the car park. However, it was suggested that we also approach Harrogate Borough Council to confirm this decision. This is when it got complicated! We were told we would have to draw up architectural plans, fill in a most complicated form and pay a fee of £300! Luckily, Knaresborough Town Council, working with Town Clerk Angela and Hannah Goslow, have been in contact with HBC and if KTC apply as a council, there will be no cost or planning required. So we are working with them and hopefully progress will be made very soon.



#### **Security Camera**

Sadly, we continue to have break-ins. Once again this has meant damage to sheds and our toilet.

We have now purchased a security camera, paid for from a Knaresborough Town Council grant, which will be installed in the next week or so. We are having to pay a small amount in IT costs, but we really do have to take action to try and reduce the risk of vandalism. Hopefully it will be useful in identifying culprits and deterring others. The camera is portable and will also be used to monitor what is put in the skip, when it arrives.

Regrettably, the toilet remains out of use. We realise this is a huge inconvenience for many and we are working towards replacing it ASAP. In the meantime, as soon as it is working, we will let you know.

After last years success, we want to provide this service again this year. However, we are very short of storage space and so do not want to over order, therefore, we plan to ask people to place an order.




## **Hedge Cutting**

This year, we decided to get the hedge cut by professionals as, over the past 15 years, it has grown too thick and high for our tools to handle. We had to wait until January, as we wanted to minimise the effect on wildlife and for Health and Safety reasons, we had to apply to NYCC to close the path.



The day we started, the weather was appalling! Despite this, we had a team of helpers from KASHS who worked with Scotton Trees and reduced the time taken from three days to two, thus reducing the cost by a third. Many thanks go to Paul Escott, for organising the contractors and to Neil Crossley, John Evans, Geoff Freeston, John Whitehead, Richard Brewster and Rob Snow for braving the elements to help. Our landlord, Knaresborough Town Council, have agreed to pay for the work.





We also now have the tools to maintain the hedge properly and will be working in the next week to reduce the width from our side. Please allow us access to the hedge by clearing away any material that is within a metre from the hedge.

#### **Knaresborough Forest Park**

Knaresborough Forest Park is a project that aims to create a special place, which would be part of the Knaresborough Forest and White Rose Forest, for local people of all ages to relax, play and get their green fingers busy planting trees and rewilding. It would provide a beautiful, tree-rich, natural parkland, which would be a protected haven for wildlife and provide educational opportunities for local youngsters, adults, voluntary groups, schools and vistors and would be owned by the community.

The land is currently in private hands and has an asking price of £405,000. The Knaresborough Forest Park Appeal is asking people to pledge to buy shares, in order to gauge local interest. The pledge is not legally binding in any way and no money will be transferred at this time. All shareholders would become members of the parkland and have voting rights.
