Our primary goal was to raise funds for KASHS and thanks to the overwhelming support, we surpassed our expectations. Key changes made a significant impact, including relocating the produce stall to the



entrance, which increased visibility and sales. A dedicated team led by Sue Snow, with help from Jan Neale and Sarah Helm, did a stellar job of securing top prices for our donated goodies—cakes, jams, chutneys, vegetables and flowers.



A special shoutout to Dave Bolton and his family for running the new tombola, which offered fantastic prizes, drawing lots of excitement and a bit of a frenzy for that Harry Potter hat, with one visitor buying £30 of tickets in their quest to secure it!

We were thrilled to also host Knaresborough Forest Park, Yorkshire Rotters and Chris Powell's second-hand garden tool stall, which



raised over £200 for the Prickly Pigs hedgehog charity, and many more who added variety to the day.

Rent Increase:

What you need to know

Our new Treasurer, Stewart Housecroft, has been carefully examining our finances.

We need to ensure that KASHS has enough money to cover our bills and can cope with an unexpected emergency.

Last year we spent more than usual., as we had to to cover the shortfall in funds for the new toilet. In addition to this, all our bills went up; water, insurance, affiliations to local and national associations. We also spent money on tools and equipment.

We made the mistake last year of not putting up our rent and, as a result, we have been short of money this summer. At our last committee meeting we made the decision to increase rents by 12% and the standard charge has by £2, to £12. On average, this means you will be paying about £6 more than last year. Some with larger plots can expect to pay a little more.

We recognise that for some members this increase may present a challenge. The last thing we want to happen is for someone in challenging financial

circumstances to have to give up their allotment, so if you need some consideration regarding payment, please contact Kirsty or Rob. Please be assured of our absolute discretion.

Visitor Alert:

Stay vigilant

Recently, there have been reports of a man sleeping in the toilet and in several sheds on site. Although he leaves when asked, he has caused some damage, including breaking the toilet lock. It is not expected to be well used over winter and there will be no water for the basin; however, if you want to use it over the winter period, we can provide you with a key, if you are happy to cover the cost of the key cutting.
